

Early History

Henry Ufford Churchill


1797 - 1868

Among the Puritan ancestors of the Churchill family emigrating from England to America during the 1600's, our branch of the family began with Josiah Churchill (1615-1686), and his wife, Elizabeth Foote. In 1638 they settled in Weathersfield, Connecticut, along the Connecticut River, a short distance from Hartford. Following through five generations came David Churchill (1771-1823) and his wife Jerusha Ufford. They were married October 14, 1792. They named their first child Henry Ufford Churchill. When their son Henry was twenty years old, they moved up the river to Portland, which also was on the same side of the river as Weathersfield. There in Portland Henry met Emily Green Hall. She was the daughter of Joel Hall, who shared half-interest, with Erasties Brainerd, in the Brown Stone Quarry situated at the edge of the river at Portland. Henry Ufford courted and on January 30, 1817*, married Emily Hall. The youngest of their family** (9th child) they named William Henry Churchill.


Notes:

* Wedding portraits were the custom in those times. Theirs were painted in oil on a special kind of wood which was treated in some fashion to prevent expanding and contracting in atmospheric changes. Then they were mounted in wide, ornate gilded frames. At the present writing these portraits are being kept in safety for the family by a Great Granddaughter of William Henry Churchill, Daphne Elizabeth Church (Wisneski).






BROWN STONE QUARRY IN PORTLAND (photo taken in 1938)

Most of our early ancestors were great sea-faring men, sailing the "High Seas" in trade with other countries around the world.

At an early age Henry Ufford Churchill went "Before the Mast" (a nautical phrase used in those days) on voyages with his father David. While growing up he learned the art and skills of safe navigation. By the time he was a grown man, he had become a great sea captain navigator and Commander like his father. His renown as one of the finest navigators of his time won him great respect and esteem.

Sailing vessels, by then, were carrying passengers as well as cargo. "People of Means" (another old-time phrase) owned their own passenger sailing vessels. One such person was Commodore Vanderbuilt of New York City, whose vessel plyed between New York and Liverpool, England. He employed our ancestor, Henry Ufford Churchill as his navigator.


On one of these voyages from Liverpool to New York, a great hurricane came upon the Vanderbuilt vessel. The passengers were terrified and frightened to such an extent they finally "gave up the ship" as lost and themselves along with it. However, their Commander never left his bridge for three days and three nights, and succeeded in bringing the ship, all the passengers and all the crew safely into New York Harbor. In gratitude to their Commander for his fine seamanship and faithfulness to duty to save the lives of all, the men passengers (thirteen in all) went directly to Tiffany's fine store on Fifth Avenue. There they ordered a solid silver trumpet to be made, engraved with the ship and its name, and the name of the Commander on one side — on the other side, the names of the thirteen men as well as all other passengers who shared in this beautiful gift. An appropriate time and place was arranged for the presentation of this gift to our ancestor. He treasured it greatly. In

time he willed it to his son William Henry Churchill* who through the years had sailed with him, and by then had become a great sea captain, navigator and commander like himself.

Note:

* William Henry Churchill, in turn, willed this trumpet to his wife, who presented it to their son John Herbert Churchill as a wedding gift.

As far as we have record, the family of John's daughter Beatrice Churchill (McClure) holds this treasured heirloom of the family. The picture of the trumpet below, was taken some years ago in the home of Beatrice Churchill McClure by a grandson of William Henry Churchill (Lewis L. Kellsey).




The trumpet is about 20 inches tall, the mouth piece and bell were gold plated over the silver, and originally it was encased in a beautiful inlaid box lined with blue plush.

WILLIAM HENRY CHURCHILL

1832-1898

Learning and voyaging with his father from early years far into adult life, William Henry Churchill experienced the thrills of nature at sea, and also a great spirit of adventure travelling to far away places. At the time of the historic "Gold Rush" to California and the far west in 1849, people were travelling not only by



land in covered wagons, but also were going in vessels by sea. William's father, Henry Ufford was commissioned by Commodore Vanderbuilt to sail the vessel Prometheus around Cape Horn and up the coast of California to San Francisco. William Henry served as First Mate in this voyage.

Other exciting happenings of voyaging together included the making of friendships, not only with business associates, but also with many other passengers, who sailed on the ships they commanded. Many of these friends extended invitations to visit in their homes and meet their families. William Henry was always welcomed with his father. At one time, they were invited to the home of the fine family of John Harvey Hebert, living on Liberty Street in New York City. It was there William Henry met Jane Hebert, whom he courted and in due time married her on January 27, 1853. At first they lived at the Churchill Homestead on Silver Street, Portland. William Henry continued sailing with his father until the coming of steam powered engines. These engines brought great changes in boat building and navigation. Henry Ufford then established



the Churchill Boat Building Yard on the Connecticut River at a place called Guildersleeve Landing, a short distance upriver (north) from Portland. William Henry operated this yard, building small steam-powered boats such as Tug Boats, for pulling heavy-laden barges from one place to another. There was a present need for such boats to pull barges, laden with stone from the Brownstone Quarry there to New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Baltimore and other cities. The brownstone was popular in those days not only for dwelling houses but also for brownstone entrances to apartment buildings, and other kinds of construction in cities and country.

When the Civil War began in 1861, Henry Ufford and William were commissioned to command steam-powered vessels to carry provisions from Boston to Louisiana through the blockade of Southern vessels to the squadrons of Northern troops. One of these vessels was named S.S. Circasion. It was armed with both small and large guns. William Henry also commanded another government-owned vessel called the General Lyons. This vessel carried supplies of uniforms and ammunition from Boston to Fort Monroe.

With the death of Henry Ufford Churchill, April 1, 1868, changes came

for William. By now he had a family of five small children. The Family Homested was to be sold, and his mother was going to live with his sister Emily Churchill (Brainerd), who lived nearby on the Post Road to Boston. Henry Ufford's will provided William with \$10,000. With this inheritance William arranged to build a home for his family in East Portland (later called Middletown). The location was on Crescent Street



(shaped like a crescent) and he built a one and one-half story house like many of that type architecture of those times. However, he continued to operate the Boat Yard and Tug Boat business all during the years his family was growing up. Henry, his oldest son, was greatly interested in his father's business and often accompanied him when he went for Tug Boat service all around Boston Harbor and along the Charles River. In time he established a Tug Boat service for his father there

and moved with the family to Somerville, Massachusetts (a suburb of Boston) where he could manage this business with his father. Their home was on Highland Avenue. By this time, Henry's sister, Mary Elizabeth Churchill, was married to Franklin Lewis Kellsey of Middletown.* They too, moved to Somerville and settled on Hudson Street, near their parents.

Franklin Lewis Kellsey was employed then by the Chelsea Clock Company (which made fine clocks specializing in "Ships Bell" movements) located north of Boston and east of Somerville.



WILLIAM HENRY CHURCHILL'S INVESTMENT AT BLODGETT LANDING, NEW HAMPSHIRE

Records as far back as the 19th Century tell us of two brothers:

George Washington Blodgett and Harvey H. Blodgett. They were living then in the town of Newbury, New Hampshire, along the east side of Lake Sunapee. Their farm and homestead was situated about four miles west of Newbury Harbor, on a road going towards New London. Although this was a County road, it was locally referred to as New London Road, and then later on became a state road numbered 101A. These brothers owned large tracts of woodland and shoreage in this area. When the steamboats began plying the lake, they named their location Blodgett's Landing.

George Blodgett was a believer and quite active in a religious movement of that day called "Spiritualism." He had cleared a section of his woodland, beyond the homestead, down the hill to the lake, to erect a stage-like platform with canopy and long narrow sitting benches amid a beautiful "Grove of Pines", thus fashioning a church-like meeting place. As a young child, I can remember this unique primitive church. Notices of the services, held here in the "Out-of-Doors", were published, not only in the newspapers of the surrounding areas, but also in those of Boston and other city locations. Interested people from a distance would come by train to Newbury Harbor, and from there by horse-drawn wagon or carriages or by steamboat to the Landing.

At this time our grandparents were living in Somerville,

Massachusetts. They, too, were interested in Spiritualism - so much so,

Grandmother was writing poems and publishing many articles on this

subject. Reading of Services being held in an Out-of-Doors meeting

place, the desire of making the trip to attend one came upon them. This would be quite an undertaking. However, they felt greatly rewarded for their effort. Both of them were great lovers of nature, so the natural setting of this Meeting Place in the midst of the beauty of the lake and mountain countryside was very appealing to them. wished to sahre this lovely experience with their families and friends. There were no cottages there then. However, George Blodgett had built many one-room "shacks" along the shore of the lake for fishermen, who came from all about, to fish for the land-locked Salmon, with which the


lake was stocked yearly by the State.



Later on, when the fishermen wished to bring their families with them, George sold them several of these shacks and a small piece of land, on which to build a single cottage. This accounts for the very crowded appearance of the cottages as we observe them at the Landing, especially south of the main wharf, today.

Harvey Blodgett, on the other hand, would sell larger tracts of land. His land adjoined his brother, George's land. So it was in 1890, our grandparents bought 20 acres of woodland and 400 feet of shoreage property on Lake Sunapee. The deed is shown on page 12. The developing of the property included roads, cottages, a well house up the hill, and a large three-crib "T" shaped

wharf with flagpole, at the end of the middle road at which the steamboats could land. Also fieldstone posts where the property joined George Blodgett's "Lakeside Road" and where the middle road joined with the State road. Other stone markers were built at the corners of the property, abutting the State road. Grandpa's sailing days were over, yet he was strong and able at the age of 58. Plans for retirement had not even been thought of in those days. He had learned the basics of construction when operating his boat building business at Gilderseeve Landing and his son, our Uncle Henry, who helped him establish the Tug Business around Boston, was greatly interested in this new venture of Grandpa's, helping him to prepare the plans and accomplishing them. When the time came for naming their estate property they decided upon "Idlehurst", a place of rest and relaxation of nature's making. Grandpa fashioned and painted the name on a large piece of sailor's canvas approximately $110' \times 13'$ stretched high up between two beautiful pine trees beside the wharf.

USAGE GUIDELINES FOR THIS GENEALOGY

This genealogy follows one of the accepted book format and numbering notation systems. The numbering is of the form a.b where a is the generation number and b is the is the child number in that generation. Each family household is listed as a unit and contains father, mother and children. The children listed under parents carry an entry including birth year and last name of spouse if married. By referencing the child's number, one can find the individual's complete information.

Each generation has an increasing generation number. Each child in a family group, in that generation has a number given in numeric sequence, oldest to youngest in their group, but not necessarily in age order among cousins. In the sixth generation (current) the numbers skip since it is expected that additional offspring will occur and extra numbers will be required as this genealogy is updated.

* * *

FACTS OF INTEREST: At present there are 101 direct descendants of William Henry known to author; 6 in generation 2, 12 in generation 3, 18 in generation 4, 38 in generation 5, and 27 in generation 6, so far. Of these, there are four sets of twins: In 2nd generation, Wesley and Helen Churchill; in 4th generation, Harriet and Helen Nissen(descended from 2.3); in 5th generation, Richard and Ginger Robinson (descended from 2.4); and in 6th generation, Allison and Aubrey Lewis (descended from 2.2). For the benefit of history buffs, William Henry's great grandfather fought in the Revolutionary War for Connecticut, his name was Joseph Churchill.

This genealogy begins with the eighth generation of Churchills in America who settled in Weathersfield, Connecticut in 1638.



How does one pick a single favorite memory of Sunapee? After 55 summers spent mostly at Sunapee the memories are more numerous than the number of years mentioned. So. a potpourri:

Nana Kellsey (Mary Elizabeth Churchill Kellsey), sailing in her canoe, Uncle Franklin (Franklin L. Kellsey) the kayak he built, then paddled or sailed; picking gallons of blue berries on Blueberry Hill, then the pies, pancakes and muffins consumed and enjoyed by all. Climbing Mt. Sunappe and Keasarge, fishing and picnics. Moonlit night and northan lights (Aurora Borealis), Joe Ryan waking the members of different cottages to gather en the dock to watch the display of shimmering lights in the sky. Another repeat of the same story just a few years ago. David, Lynn, Artie, Barbara, Gary, Kevin, myself and various guests awed by the display of light shimmering and shooting over the entire sky.

The "Jenkin's" games---my first memories of hearing the Command, "Jenkin says Hands Up", at Indian Road Cottage (now Hasty Pudding)---Nana Kellsey in command at one end of the table, Uncle Franklin, my Dad, Joe Ryan or some other priviledged guest at the other end. My last memory, a Jenkins game the weekend prior to David and Lynn's wedding. The game went on hour after hour, in shifts. The number of players greater than the space at two tables placed together, met baby sitting needs of different players. The end came with the losing term captain leaving the table, walking across the porch, across the road, out onto the dock and into the Lake. This had been decided by all to be the price the losing term would pay. The game was played at Sunflower.

My brother brings fond memories also. We were not allowed to sail until we could swim a certain number of feet. I had passed my swimming test, but Artie had not. We decided to build our own sailboat. Why building our own sailboat made sailing safe without being able to swim the required number of feet is reasoning only a determined child could fathom. Artie and I cut down a very straight tree in the woods, trimed it and fitted it into the hole in the rowboat made for a sail. Our sail was a sheet, the rudder an oar. We had a grand sail, indeed it was a very rapid and exhilarating trip from our dock to the beach just past Owl's Nest. We

A) The Lake had whipped up into white caps, the wind blowing straight down from Mt. Sunapee towards Georges Mills.

B) We had no means of tacking to turn the boat about and head home. We took the sail down and started to row back against the wind and waves. By the time we had rounded the point at Owl's Nest our boat was at a stand still even with one of us on each oar. Just about then Artie reminded me that he couldn't swim, and I would catch the very devil if I didn't get him home safely. The only alternative to rowing was swimming the boat home. I was a strong swimmer so....after our very brilliant sail down the Lake, our return was under very adverse conditions. Artie sat crossed legged, (Indian Style) inside the boat while I swam the distance between Owl's Nest and our dock towing the boat behind me. It was a slow and non-stop return, the shoreline much to rocky to stop along the way. We made it to our dock, safe but cold. The end, our sailing for that summer.

I remember also the Casino--- Nana Kellsey and I would dress up and walk the board walk from Indian Road Cottage to the Casino to see a show or movie. Two outstanding events were a Minstrel Show and the Wizard of OZ.

Sparklers on the 4th, to more elaborate fire works on the dock in the past few years.

Snow around the bottom of the pine trees on Columbus Day---Ice heaves on the snow covered lake in December --- Christmas in the Cabin.

I remember the sun-set watching and rather early during World War II seeing the boot of Italy in the clouds and then seeing it consumed by a dark gray cloud formation in the shape of a wolf head. A year or so later we watched a sun set in August Of 1946 and as we watched a golden cross appeared in the sky. Church bells rang out two days later announcing the end of World War II.

Last summer I watched my grandchildren Richard and Carry-Ann take their first swim in Sunapee, all prior summers were spent in Florida, their home.

Sunapee is --- It has been in the past --- May it go on into eternity!







The Churchill cottage was near the water at Lake Sunapee, and my mother cautioned my brother and me not toplay in or near the water. I was about four years old, and one day when we came back to the cottage, I was soaking wet. Mother was angry, and reminded me that she told us not to go into the water.
