A Portion of page xi from "The Churchill Family in America" by Gardner Asaph Churchill and Nathaniel Wiley Churchill, found in the DAR Library (and probably other genealogical libraries).

I would suggest a careful reading of the article on this subject in the Encyclopedia Brittannica, and also the many references to John Churchill, Duke of Marlborough, under the latter title, "Domes-day Book," which contains the records of surveys in England up to 1086 A.D., showing the grants of "William the Conqueror" to his followers, with conditions of said lands, etc., contains the name of Roger de Courcil, who is said to have been the ancestor of the English and American Churchills. Armorial bearings or coats-of-arms were first known about 1120 A.D.

The name Churchill is found in English records as Courcelle, Courcil, Curichill, Chercile, Churchil, Churchall, Churchell, and Churchill, the last being the accepted form for many generations.

I have not been able to find just when or to whom this coat-ofarms was granted, but in "Collins' Peerage," Vol. I., page 365 (footnote), it is said to have been claimed by Sir John Churchill, son of Jasper, of Bradford, No. 16. The records of Herald's College, England, confirm this claim. He may have inherited it from ancestors generations back, for all evidence I have found, possibly from Bartholomew (No. 5), who was knighted under King Stephen.

PREFACE

In the 1985 reunion yearbook, there was a historical perspective on the Churchill boat building yards, the silver trumpet gift to Henry Ufford Churchill, and the purchase of the property known as Idlehurst, Blodgetts Landing, NH. Genealogy detail started with William Henry and Jane Douglas Hebert Churchill.

This issue provides some early history of the ancestors of both William Henry and his wife, interesting notes of weather of early days, Jane Churchill's poetry, and her son Richard's Kansas ranch.

The updated genealogical detail (in usual book form) is provided as before, but the current family information, photos and extra writings are compiled in the portion where descendants are listed in family groups under each child of William Henry.

A new addition is the Memorial page.

Early History/Genealogy of William Henry Churchill and Jane Douglas Hebert Churchill.

In the previous reunion book, it was indicated that the direct Churchill line came from England to America during the 1600's and was made up of several branches who settled in New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New Jersey and Virginia. Our American branch began with Josiah Churchill (he spelled it Churchell) and his wife Elizabeth Foote, who settled in Weathersfield, CT in 1638.

Josiah's fifth child, first son, was Joseph, born 1649, married 1674, and his first son was Nathaniel, born 1677, who married Mary Hurlbut. Their second son was John Churchill, born 1705, who married Bethia Stocking and lived in Middletown, CT.

John's son, Joseph Churchill, born 1734, fought in the Revolutionary War as Captain of a Connecticut line (providing an acceptable ancestor for National Society Daughters of the American Revolution membership for a number of family women). Joseph married Prudence Tryon in 1754 and they had a son David.

David Churchill (1771-1823) married Jerusha Ufford (1771-1805) in 1792. Their third child of six was Henry Ufford Churchill (1797-1868), who married Emily Green Hall of Portland, CT in 1817. Henry was a ship commander and made frequent trips from Boston to Glascow, England. Their ninth and youngest child was William Henry Churchill.

Details on these generations can be located in these books: "The Churchill Family in America" and "Genealogy and Biography of the Connecticut Branch of Churchill Family in America" available in many genealogical libraries.

The early generations of Jane Douglas Hebert are found in handwritten information given to Grace Kellsey Worth by her mother; a will of John Jacob Morley. 1797; and a book mentioned below.

On Jane Hebert's fathers side, much of the information comes from her great uncle's will, John Jacob Morley, who died in England in 1797 and was named for his grandfather, Sir John Jacob, 3rd, baroner of England. Sir John had two daughters: Dorothy married the Rev. Abraham Oakes; Catherine married Captain Morley (brother to J. J. Morley). Dorothy's daughter, Dorothy Oakes, married James Hebert and they had a son Hildebrand Oakes Hebert. Catherine's daughter Dorothy Morley, married Mr. Harvey and they had a daughter, Susan. Interesting as it is, these second cousins, Susan Harvey and Hildebrand Oakes Hebert, married. They had two children, John Henry and Mary. John Henry Hebert married Elizabeth Smith and they had five children, the fourth of whom was Jane Douglas Hebert.

On her mother's side, it begins with John Eales (later Eells) in New Canaan, CT, and his wife, Mary. Their son, Samuel, called Major Eells, married Anna Lenthall, and they, also, named their son Samuel. He was born 1666, was a Colonel and married Martha Whiting. [These generations are detailed in "Eells Genealogy" family record book at DAR library]

Colonel Samuel had a son, John, baptized 1703, who became a minister, married Anna Beard, and they had a son Jeremiah Beard Eells, who was a Revolutionary soldier for Connecticut. He married Lois Benedict and had 12 children, all of whom lived. One of their children was Elizabeth (Betsey) Eells, who married Josiah Smith in New York City about 1800. Their daughter, Elizabeth Smith, was Jane Hebert's mother.

WILD STORMS AT SUNAPEE SEPTEMBER 1821

[Editor's note: Long before our ancestors purchased Idlehurst, the area experienced wild storms far worse that the hurricane of 1939 that devastated many of the grand old trees along the shores of Blodgett Landing, in the woodland of Idlehurst, and leveled the trees on the opposite shore and hill (Burkhaven Hill), so that for years afterward all that grew there were blueberry bushes, which we loved to harvest.]

In September of 1821 there was a season of uncommon storms and tempests. On September 3rd, a most violent storm raged on the whole Atlantic coast, from Portsmouth to Charleston, in which many lives and a great amount of property were destroyed. In New London area, from 11:30 to 12:30 pm. so great was the fury, that the scene was truly awful. The deafening roar of the storm and the mingled, crashing of windows and chimneys, and falling timber, with the continuous torrents of rain, together inspired the beholder with terror. After that the wind shifted into the northwest and the fury abated. By 4 pm. the weather was calm and serene. This storm, thought one of the most violent ever known in New Hampshire, produced little injury, in comparison with the whirlwind of September 9th.

It was a Sunday, unusually hot and sultry, the air having a heavy feeling and it was difficult to breathe. At about 4 pm. the clouds began to gather in the west and in a short time formed into one large black cloud which rolled about and began to spread along at a terrible rate making loud noises and tearing up everything that came in its way. Trees were torn up and the remaining ones were leveled to the ground. The tornado was said to have commenced near Lake Champlain; hail storms and violent winds were also experienced in other parts of the east coast, at the very The whirlwind entered New Hampshire at Cornish, and crossing the mountain, gathered in strength as it passed through Croydon, a little south of the Croydon peak. Its course took it southward across the northern part of Lake Sunapee, striking the west shore of the lake where the Granliden Hotel stood later on. The path of the storm was about one half mile wide, and it picked up houses and objects and carried them for miles. At the home of Harvey Huntoon, near Sunapee Harbour, it picked up a feather bed on which a baby was sleeping, carried it across the lake and into the Andover area, a distance of 17 miles. The dead baby was found days later. While crossing Lake Sunapee, the whirlwind drew up vast quantities of water, an appearance quite terrifying to those fishermen who were near it. From a circle about 350 feet in diameter at the surface of the water, it expanded on each side toward the heavens, dark as midnight, but occasionally illuminated by vivid flashes of lightning. Then the storm veered toward New London. The extent of the whirlwind in New London was about four miles, varying in width as the column alternately rose and fell. From there it passed up the northwest side of Mt. Kearsarge apparently in two columns, which closed again as one as it veered southward again and settled down the opposite side into Warner. Some houses were entirely demolished, not a timber, nor a board, nor a brick left. A saw mill was torn down and twelve thousand boards in the mill carried away by the whirlwind. The shores of the lake on the following morning, were covered with the ruins of buildings, fences, furniture etc. which had fallen out of the tempest. The homeless survivors in all these areas huddled together in fear, lamenting the destruction, and reliving the horrors of that instant in which houses, barns, trees, fences, fowl and people were all lifted from the earth into the whirlwind and dashed into a thousand pieces.

JANE DOUGLAS HEBERT CHURCHILL 1832 - 1919

The original deed for Idlehurst, printed in the 1985 reunion brochure, indicated that it was purchased on October 9, 1890, in the name of Jane Douglas Hebert Churchill, William Henry's wife. That is an interesting fact, since in 1890 few women owned property.

She was quite a lady, who live to the ripe age of 87, writing poetry, alot of it about Sunapee.

In 1990, the present family property owners met at Idlehurst to celebrate 100 years of Idlehurst. At that time a book of Jane Churchill's selected poems was published. Copies are available at this reunion from Emily Robinson.

[As you read through the current family biographies, you will note that there are an abundance of musicians, artists, poets, writers, athletes, dancers, those who like horses and all kinds of sports. We inherited some wonderful genes! Ed.]

The Churchill Ranch

from Wendell N. Crim

(Note: The information in this writing is presented without reference to my records which are currently packed away in storage until we move into our new home in mid May. So the dates used are approximations.)

The land was homesteaded by Richard Gerard Churchill in Finney county Kansas east of Garden City. One source puts the date at 1865, but that sounds a little early to me. Richard was the father of Jane Churchill Nissen, grandfather to Harriet, Helen, Ruth and Priscilla Nissen and my great-grandfather. Jane Churchill grew up on the ranch during the turn of the century. While living in Massachusetts as a young woman, she married Harry Nissen.

They returned to Kansas in the 1910's. Their first 3 children were born on the ranch. In the mid 1920's the Nissen family returned east. The automobile was sufficiently developed by this time for them to travel by car between Massachusetts and Kansas. The trip lasted 2 weeks including many nights camped by the roadside. Motels were a future development. These travels took place about the time Dwight Eisenhower led a group of soldiers on a coast-to-coast convoy eventually resulting in his Presidential administration establishing the interstate system of roads we zip down today compressing the trip to Kansas from Boston to 3 or 4 days.

The lore passed on to me has it Richard Churchill was a sailor out of Connecticut when the west opened for homesteading. He decided on a change in lifestyles to the rancher / farmer claiming his stake about 15 miles east of Garden City. At the time, the popular theory being advanced by the U.S. Government stated rain "followed the plow." All the west needed was enough ground broken and the annual rainfall would be more like what falls east of the 100th meridian. The dust bowl days of the 1930's showed this theory incorrect. The property is distinguished by a very shallow ravine carved east to west as part of the headwaters to Pawnee Creek.

This creek flows into the Arkansas River at Larned, KS which flows to the Mississippi River and the Gulf of Mexico. The 18 square mile watershed west of the ranch lies at the eastern edge of the flat expanse east of the Rocky Mountains marking the start of rain's 3,000 ft drop to sea level. The ravine is dry most of the time.

1995 may be an exception. Average annual rainfall is 16-23 inches compared to 30-40 inches east of the 100th meridian. The odd storm can dump 18 inches leading to flooding in Pawnee Creek proper a few miles east of the ranch. Flood data shows a notable absence in flooding at Larned since 1970. During the 25 years prior to that time, floods occurred every 3 to 5 years. In addition to reduced to go dry.

The change in water table is attributable, according to local folk, to increased irrigation farming and cattle feed lots. Both use wells as a water source. An article in the New York Times traced the lowered water table to California draining large volumes of water from the western side of the continental divide. In short, water is still the central issue west of the 100th. And water politics is alive and well.

The Crim's recently viewed 16mm films taken by Harry Nissen in 1926 after Harry, Jane and family moved back to Boston. The Nissen family was on a trip to Yellowstone including a swing through Kansas visiting the ranch. Richard Churchill is shown driving a wheelbarrow with watering can to the windmill driven well trailed by 7 year old Harriet and Helen. Jane and Harry demonstrated for the camera considerable skills with a horse on the open range. Later in the film we were treated to sights in the newly created national park including Old Faithful and the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone. Seeing a spry Richard Churchill in movies dated 1926 makes me question the homestead date of 1865. He would have been on the ranch for 60+ years in 1926. While not impossible, it does seem a bit extreme. Or the Churchill's have exceptional longevity genes.

In 1986 my wife Eva and I visited the ranch over Christmas break. One look at the night sky helped us realize how a sailor could feel at home in Western Kansas. Unobstructed by city lighting or gaseous debris, the space-black sky blazed with razor-sharp stars in 3D. Being east coast residents at the time, the deafening silence was restorative to the soul. Relative to the ranch, Lake Sunapee and Hillsboro Camp are busy areas burdened with ambient noise from the dynamohum of human activity. On that trip we did extensive aerial photography of the ranch.

Recently a local Kansas land preservation group proposed building a dam on the ranch as part of a 73 dam system in the Pawnee Creek watershed. Based on our aerial records, we determined the damage to the ranch land would be greater than the benefits to the watershed. It was also evident our lack of participation would not jeopardize the overall goal of the project. The caretaker of the property, who has farmed in the area all his life, agreed and we declined to have the dam constructed.

Eva and I are again living in the busy confines of a metroplex. So we'll be visiting the ranch more regularly, reviving our souls and pondering the brave people who broke the path before us. At this point the land is used for cattle grazing. Small strips of east-west oriented land, outside of the ravine, have been farmed in past years. Based on the barn, shed, pens and chutes present in 1986, I think Richard Churchill also worked with livestock. In recent years all of the structures have been removed.


Today, a fence line is the only marking of the Churchill homestead. At the eastern end is an extensive system of prairie dog burrows. The residents send quite a chatter into the wind-blown quiet. The largest herd of deer I've ever seen lurked behind shallow rolls in the land. Their weariness of man was greater than their hunterfed, quasi-domestic suburban cousins of the east. The sky is ruled by great birds. Rough-legged hawks maintain vigils from cottonwood and fence post vantage points setting to wing when rabbits or mice stray from protection. Sparrow hawks work over the smallest ground mammals and large insects. Turkey vultures carry out their undertaker duties. The land of the west is subtle. Sit still and observe. It opens a window to the present vitality.

Adjacent to the ranch is a schoolhouse built by Richard Churchill and Harry Nissen. The stone walls may have come from the bluffs of the ravine west of the Churchill home site. These walls and the roof structure remained erect in 1986 though the roof had holes. A primitive building at best, the gable work suggests a wood artisan was present during construction. Rounded, almost carved, shingles on the gable instead of functional clapboard could have been the expression of a developing wood crafter, Harry Nissen. Molding a talent brought to maturity 20 to 30 years later in corner of a cultivated field not on the Churchill property, the only structure for miles in any direction. On our photographic flights from the Garden City airport, it was the most prominent mark on the vast flatness.

Richard was also an author. I have read his book on economics where he holds out against the evil of becoming indebted and paying interest on debit. 

Little Red Canoe at 50

from Wendell N. Crim

In 1989, Eva and I acquired one of the red canvas canoes from Hillsboro Camp put out to pasture by aluminum and plastic. We named her *Aunt Jane* in memory of my grandparents Harry and Jane Nissen using the name by which my grandmother was known to the campers. After sending the canoe's serial number from the keel to Old Town, they sent us a copy of the construction log, a sales brochure and bill of original sale.

The keel was laid the day before Pearl Harbor was bombed in 1942. Harry Nissen of Hillsboro Camp was listed as the original owner the following April. The first order of business for me was a winter project refinishing the interior woodwork. The job was completed with a new coat of marine varnish, new cane seats and a brass name plate from Old Town. Eva bought us Old Town paddles for our 4th wedding anniversary. As a celebration of 50 years afloat, we took advantage of living in Michigan close to the Great Lakes.

Numerous bodies of water in northwestern New Jersey were enjoyed while we lived there (we didn't think it possible either). During the last week of October 1989 and the last week of daylight savings time, we worked half days and paddled every afternoon. Michigan was a challenge due to its size. But we soon found rivers, then bays and inland lakes within a reasonable drive which were not serviced by canoe liveries or ramps for motorized boats giving us peace, quiet and space.

During the canoe's 50th year we combined our access to aviation weather with good maps of Michigan's coastline. Parts of Lakes Michigan and Huron were identified which are sheltered from prevailing southwesterly winds of summer or the howling northwesterly behind a cold front. During the summer of 1992, *Aunt Jane* was taken on 25 different outings ranging from crystal clear salmon rivers to paddling Lake Michigan at 4 different locations chosen based on wind direction and velocity. We covered as many as 25 miles of flat water in a day. *Aunt Jane* also plied the waters of Lake Huron, particularly Saginaw Bay.

Our favorite big lake location was the northern coast of Beaver Island in northern Lake Michigan. Getting there required a 3 hour drive to the ferry, 3 hours on the ferry (\$150 round-trip) and then another couple of miles to the lodge on the northern shore. Beaver Island features coastline, adjacent islands and harbors. There are two large inland lakes to paddle when the big lake is unsettled. A canoe builder on the island told us of paddling the 20 some miles from the mainland to Beaver and the adjacent islands in wooden canoes. He pointed out short canoes fit between waves making them less likely to breakup in rough weather.

On Beaver Island, we discovered how ideal this little canoe is for photographing waterfowl. Saginaw Bay was also particularly well suited for her and close to our home. Protected by small islands on one side and the mainland on the other, wave action was minimized. Plus the water was too shallow for motorboats. These two factors make an ideal summer home for waterfowl of many species. The stealth capabilities of the wood and canvas canoe allowed us to eavesdrop on afternoon chatter sessions of the ducks.

Ducks spend summer afternoons in shallow water surrounded by tall reeds where they have opened lookout points. They seem to be continually laughing at each others jokes. With a quiet canoe, its possible to ease up on their blind side and imagine the content of their chatter. The blue heron has been the most fascinating of the waterfowl.

Our goal of a tight photo of big blue on the wing took 3 years to realize. Yet I want a better one. In the process to collecting this trophy, we've been treated to the flight of Arctic turns, dives of king fishers, the song of loons and the schooling of fledgling eagles in the rudiments of flight.

The paddles we use are the longest available, in excess of 5 ft or half the canoe's length. Yes, in complete violation of every rule known to campers on recommended paddle length. With these long lever arms, paddling upstream is an option we elect often. This saves the logistical problems of positioning / retrieving multiple vehicles when the canoe is a one-way traveler. On flat water we can out run fishing boats powered by trawling motors. On a related note, the best way to move a fisherman and his beeping finder from your favorite area is to tell him about the big fish being caught "on the other side of the lake." Once it sinks in, he's gone.

Aunt Jane no longer rides on top of the car. All but 2 of her 11 foot length fit inside our minivan. This was also true with the mid-sized hatchback we drove before the minivan. No longer am I willing to stress the 50 year old frame and deck in the winds of highway speed. Driving at 65 mph into 20 mph of headwind puts 85 mph across the canoe. Force increases to the 3rd power with speed meaning that extra 20 mph increases destructive forces by 200%. Bottom line: she comes off only once.

At one point after the interior had been brightened by sanding and new varnish, we considered removing the canvas cover. We hoped to clean up the wood exterior and then seal it with a clear fiberglass so the beautiful wood of the hull could be enjoyed. After reading up on the subject and talking with wooden canoe renovators and builders, we abandoned the idea.

Canvas covered canoes, when stored properly, like the Nissens and Donaheys have always done, almost never develop dry rot. This is particularly true when white ash, arbor vita, is used. *Aunt Jane* has white ash decks. The wicking action of the canvas cover dries the wood completely. A plastic sealer still leaks enough water to penetrate the wood, but keeps it from drying. So fiberglass sealed wooden canoes develop dry rot and soon are gone. Fiberglass is also made cloudy by UV light from the sun. Combine this with the white marks from scratches and soon the once clear coat again has the woodwork hidden with ugliness. After we make a few more visits to recanvasing shops, one will be chosen to tailor *Aunt Jane* a new dress of canvas. Probably in hunter green this time.

Since the canoe has been in our care, two household moves have been made with professional movers. From New Jersey to Michigan, we coached the movers into building a support structure around her in the trailer eliminating potential damage by a shifting load. From Michigan to Indiana, the crew gladly secured her to the rafters of a second trailer above Eva's grand piano far from danger. For storage at home we continue to use the system Bob and Priscilla Donahey use. Two trapezes on pulleys are anchored to the rafters in the garage above the cars. The canoe rests in a trapeze, at the bow and the stern. For storage, she is raised to the ceiling. There her wood can dry completely and is out of the path of destructive forces. In the days she was transported on the car roof, the canoe was simply lowered onto the car, secured and away we went in about 5 minutes.

Today, I take a few extra minutes placing her inside the car where she is chauffeured to the day's appointed voyage. For longer trips, we are considering building a shipping crate. She could then be sent ahead to Rangely, ME or the Boundary Waters of Minnesota. We could then fly in joining $Aunt\ Jane$ for a few delightful days paddling in clear quiet waters.

Sunapee Story

Over labor day of 1989, my wife and I saw Lake Sunapee from above the Presidential range. We had flown our plane to Rangely, ME for the holiday. On the return trip to our home, then in New Jersey, the weather was exceptionally clear and calm. We decided to find our way home using only ground features without the usual maps and electronic navigation systems. Immediately after wheels-up, Mt. Washington was sighted and we set our course for its summit.

Passing 2,000 ft above the Presidential range, we could see the Atlantic Ocean to the east. To monitor our southwesterly route, we sighted 4 distinct geographical features for guidance: Mt. Chocorua, Lake Winnipesaukee, Lake Sunapee and Mt. Monadnock. They became our stepping stones across New Hampshire's brook of air. Sighting all 4 from above Mt. Washington was the crowning moment of a wonderful holiday weekend. Lake Sunapee took it's place with the giants of New Hampshire in that view.

Sunapee's inclusion was all the more special to us because of the family history associated with the lake. As we passed east of Lake Sunapee, Hillsboro Camp emerged from its nest behind the hills. While we have flown this route a number of times using electronic navigation, it was most fully appreciated with the nav systems powered down, the maps folded and our noses pressed against the window.

After crossing Monadnock, we took up a WSW heading to the Hudson River which we followed south to the New York City region.

IN MEMORY of Harriet Jane Nissen

September 21, 1918 — April 16, 1995

Harriet and her twin sister Helen were born September 21, 1918, in Finney County, Kansas (Southwestern part of the state). They were premature by about a month. At birth they were so small that their mother could put her wedding ring on them as a bracelet.



In 1922 they moved to Lancaster, Massachusetts, and about a year later moved to Lexington, Massachusetts. Harriet went through the Lexington schools graduating from high school in 1937. In high school her interests were sports, art and chemistry.

In the fall of 1937 she entered Nason College in Springvale, Maine. (This school is no longer in existence.) She graduated in 1941 with a degree in Home Economics. Her first year out of college she taught at Tilton-Northfield High School. The next year she returned to Nason College as a chemistry instructor. She remained there until the fall of 1946 when she took a new job as a Home Demonstration Agent for the state of Maine and was stationed in Fort Kent, Maine. Since her retirement she has been busy helping to run a family camp in Hillsboro with her sister Priscilla and brother-in-law Bob. Harriet loved to cook and, during this time, she canned pickles, made fudge and peanut butter cups to sell at a local farm stand.





Several historic notes they wish to share:

Some of Dick's Churchill ancestors and some of Carolyn's Hotchkiss ancestors are burried close to each other in the Middletown, CT cemetery! Small world.

Dick remembers accompanying his Mother, Jane Sweetland, to the lake in the 1920's. He reports: "My Father, Elmer Sweetland, took us to Grand Central Station in NY for the early morning train. We changed trains in Claremont Junction and got to Lake Sunapee Landing in Newbury in late afternoon. There we and our baggage boarded the steamboat Kearsarge for the ride over to Blodgett's Landing, where we were met by Nana (Elizabeth) and Grandpa (Franklin) Kellsey.

[This particular memory prompted the use of the picture on the following page. Ed.]

Many of the 4th generation family members remember our parents talking about coming to Idlehurst and Blodgett's Landing via steamboat. Aunt Helen was always telling stories about incidents revolving around the boats. Here is an actual ad from 1912, republished in a local Sunapee paper, Daily Eagle, on August 14, 1968.





BOOK-STYLE GENEALOGY WITH DATES, PLACES, AND ADDRESSES

This genealogy begins with the eighth generation of a certain line of Churchills descended from Josiah Churchill who settled in Wethersfield, CT in 1638.

This genealogy follows one of the accepted book format and numbering systems. The numbering is in the form $\underline{a}.\underline{b}$ where \underline{a} is the generation number and \underline{b} is the child number in that generation. Each child in a family group, in that generation, has a number given in numeric sequence, oldest to youngest in their group, but not necessarily in age order amoung cousins. In the sixth generation (current) the numbers skip in order to allow for additional entries in family groups.
